



Tokyo-Yokohama, Taipei-Keelung: Infrastructure and Port Societies as Stratified Landscapes

Concept:

As capital cities open to the world, their infrastructures and port societies may transform, yet persist as layered landscapes shaped by civil engineering, architecture, and urban planning. These historical strata, while sometimes destroyed in war or disaster, can also temporarily sustain everyday life. This symposium opens with Sayaka Uehara, whose photography traces spirits and histories embedded in the landscape. Focusing on the Tokyo-Yokohama and Taipei-Keelung axes through the lens of Okinawa, we ask: how can we reinhabit and reappropriate these spaces? Bringing together scholars from Tokyo and Taipei, the meeting explores historical and methodological approaches to infrastructure and aims to build paths for future collaboration.
